This session will **briefly** review the basics of RHC services and non RHC services for both independent and provider based Rural Health Clinics to establish a good foundation prior to delving into the more advanced services of Chronic Care Management, Transitional Care Management, Telehealth/Telemedicine Services, Behavioral Health Services as well as Preventative Health Services, including Intensive Behavioral Therapy for Obesity, IPPE vs AWV and Subsequent Wellness Visits. Review of the FINAL RULE, which included new information on some of these services, will also be included in this session. This session will be presented in two parts due to the volume of content.

In this session, the basics of cost reporting will be discussed. What information is required to complete an accurate Cost Report; the need for Office Managers, Coders and Providers (not just upper management) to know how changes made within the RHC practice can positively or negatively affect their encounter rate; or simply know if a new service is covered as an RHC encounter.

In this session, coverage and billing issues will be reviewed for the Care Management Services discussed in Part I and II sessions; Administrative physicals as well as review of the new billing guidelines for IUDs/subdermal implant contraceptive products. This session will also include examples of claims processing and expected payments for the RHC services when Medicaid/KanCare coverage is secondary or tertiary; claims processing for QMB patients and services which are processed as Non Covered by Primary but are covered services by the Medicaid program. In addition, an update on the RFP for the new KanCare contract will be provided. A brief reminder will be provided on the new enrollment requirements.
